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# Concert at Strathmore to Benefit the PAAA Scholarship

# **Chopin: The Great Chamber Music** February 25, 8pm at Strathmore

Pianist Brian Ganz continues his journey through the complete works of Chopin! For this concert he is joined by cellist Carter Brey, principal cellist of the New York Philharmonic, and violinist Laura Colgate, concertmaster of the National Philharmonic.

Brian Ganz, Piano

CELLO / PIANO Introduction and Polonaise in C major, Op. 3 the rarely heard Grand Duo Concertante on themes from Robert le Diable and the masterful Sonata for Cello and Piano, Op. 65

PIANO / VIOLIN / CELLO Trio in G minor, Op. 8 Ganz's phenomenal interpretation of pieces from Chopin's catalog continues to memorably check off more and more works by the Polish Romantic composer from his to-do list in the project he calls "Extreme Chopin." Almost all of Chopin's compositions are for piano solo, but the upcoming concert - 13th in the project - features his complete chamber works composed for piano and strings. Ganz will be joined by cellist Carter Brey, and violinist Laura Colgate.

**Carter Brey** was appointed principal cellist of the New York Philharmonic in 1996. He rose to international attention in 1981 as a prizewinner in the Rostropovich International Cello Competition; His other awards include the Gregor Piatigorsky Memorial Prize, and an Avery Fisher Career Grant. Mr. Brey is faculty member of the Curtis Institute of Music, He is also cellist in the New York Philharmonic String Quartet, which performs widely throughout the U.S.

Violinist **Laura Colgate** enjoys a versatile career as a chamber and orchestral musician, soloist, educator, curator, activist, and innovator. She is currently the Concertmaster of The National Philharmonic at Strathmore in Bethesda, MD. She is the Executive and Artistic Director of the Boulanger Initiative, an advocacy organization for women composers based in DC.

**Brian Ganz** is the laureate of the Marguerite Long Jacques Thibaud and the Queen Elisabeth of Belgium International Piano Competitions, He has appeared as a soloist with such orchestras as the St. Louis Symphony, the St. Petersburg Philharmonic, the Baltimore Symphony, the National Philharmonic, and many others, and has performed with such conductors as Leonard Slatkin, Marin Alsop, Mstislav Rostropovich, Piotr Gajewski and Yoel Levi.

Ganz embarked on his "Extreme Chopin" project at the suggestion of the Founding Artistic Director of the National Philharmonic, Maestro Piotr Gajewski, who saw it as a way to celebrate the bicentennial of Chopin's birth. Over a dozen years later, the annual all Chopin concerts draw throngs of enthusiastic lovers of the Polish composer to the beautiful Music Center at Strathmore. At other times, Brian can be heard in venues in our area, throughout the country and worldwide. The PAAA was fortunate to have him perform at the Chopin Concert benefiting our scholarship program in 2014 at St. Luke's church in McLean. In appreciation of his contribution to promotion of Polish music, the American Council for Polish Culture recognized Brian Ganz with its 2020 Cultural Achievement Award

# Together Again: PAAA Wigilia 2022

Among the Polish traditions, Christmas Eve reigns supreme in the hearts of many. Filled with religious symbolism and steeped in customs handed down generation to generation, *Wigilia* is more than just an annual gathering of friends and family, it is a manifestation of our faith, values, customs and more. Our organization has been hosting an annual Christmas *Wigilia* gathering for over forty years now, and members and friends were eager to resume this festive gathering that had been paused first by the pandemic and last year by a fire at the Arts Club of Washington.

On Sunday, December 18, over fifty PAAA members and friends gathered at the Arts Club mansion for our traditional Wigilia dinner and to celebrate Polish culture and togetherness. The Arts Club President Henry Sienkiewicz welcomed all to the stately Cleveland Abbe House as guests took their seats. PAAA President Matthew Stefanski delivered welcoming remarks and introduced special guests including Colonel Romuald Lipinski, a Veteran of the Polish II Corps who fought at the Battle of Monte Cassino during World War II and previously served as PAAA Vice President, as well as representatives of the Embassy of the Republic of Poland, Vice Consuls Ewa Pietrasieńska and Edyta Hołdyńska. Wigilia, whether held around one's familial dining table or at an organized function, always begins with the sharing of the oplatek. It was no different here, as Father Philip Majka blessed and distributed the Polish Christmas wafer and attendees exchanged well wishes for the coming year. Following dinner, which featured Wigilia staples such as barszcz, herring, baked fish, pierogi, kapusta, and makowiec, guests were treated to a beautiful artistic program organized by PAAA board member and artistic advisor Dr. Laura Kafka-Price.

A well known soprano, Laura Kafka-Price performed a beautiful Polish carol "*Gdy Śliczna Panna*". Pianist Wanda O'Brien-Trefil followed with a rendition of Chopin's Mazurka Op. 7 No. 1 in B flat Major. Berklee College of Music student Rosalinda Sherman captivated the audience with "O Holy Night." Pianist Alvin Smithson accompanied the singers and in a separate solo did an improvisation on the Ukrainian folk song "*Shchedryk*," known throughout the world as "Carol of the Bells." Stasia and Olek, as the Joyful Skrypczuk Duo, performed a popular Ukrainian song "*Chervona Ruta*."

The music from Ukraine in this year's program served as a symbol of our ongoing solidarity with the Ukrainian people. To the Ukrainians now living in Poland, and other welcoming countries and to those huddling in their bombed-out cities and villages or facing the enemy in battle, we send most fervent wishes that *Shchedryk*, the bountiful evening, be soon celebrated in their free homeland.

The artistic program concluded with a group sing-along of Polish *kolędy* and American carols, including "*Oj maluśki, maluśki*; Wśród nocnej ciszy, *Dzisiaj w Betlejem*," "Hark! The Herald Angels Sing", and ending with a resounding "We Wish You a Merry Christmas". The Joyful Skrypczuk Duo led everyone in singing and even some dancing as guests were encouraged to embrace the joy of the season. Many guests left the evening carrying gift baskets with Polish treats won during the raffle donated by PAAA board members, but all guests left with their bellies full and their spirits filled with Polish Christmas charm.

We thank all who joined us for our *Wigilia*, and especially recognize our dedicated *Wigilia* committee chair and members Margaret Butler, Celia Larkin, Rose Kobylinski, Eve Marie Szczepanski, Stasia Skrypczuk and Laura Kafka-Price. 
## PAAA Scholarship Program is Open for 2023

The PAAA Scholarship Committee invites Polish American students residing or studying in the District of Columbia, Virginia or Maryland to apply for the 2023 scholarship grants. It is always good to see what our past scholarship winners are doing and we are happy to note that one of them recently had his article published in the SAH ARCHIPEDIA, an online encyclopedia of the Society of Architectural Historians. Gavin Moulton, a 2021 recipient of a PAAA grant, contributed the article on the Mazer-Cressman Cigar Company Plant in Detroit's Poletown. The focus of the article is the 1937 Cigar Strike by Polish women who "formed the backbone of the cigar industry and faced discrimination based on gender and ethnicity." ## A Guide to Polish Sites in the United States



From majestic churches to small roadside chapels, from larger-than-life statues of Revolutionary war heroes Kosciuszko and Pułaski to small plagues honoring Polish workers who died striking for fair treatment, the innumerable contributions of Polish immigrants and their descendants on communities in North America can be seen on monuments, bridges, churches, cultural centers, and cemeteries across the continent. These "footprints" of Polonia (the Polish diaspora), commemorating towering events and figures from history that are a source of great pride among Polish Americans, are cataloged for readers in this unique volume. The Polish American Historical Association (PAHA) developed this guide with the goal of highlighting the important ways in which Polish immigrants contributed to history, politics, arts and society in the U.S., Canada, and parts of Mexico and the Caribbean. Volunteers from Polish organizations all over North America and provided summaries and pictures for over 200 entries. Footprints of Polonia can serve as the perfect travel companion for anyone who wants to learn about the rich history and heritage of the Polish diaspora. It is also an excellent resource for Polish language schools and Polish American organizations who want to learn more about and take pride in sites of interest in their area.





# PAAA Spring Membership Meeting Guest Speaker: Dr. William Hal Gorby

The PAAA Spring Membership Meeting will take place on May 7, 2023, from 2:00-5:00 PM at the Arts Club of Washington. It will include presentation of PAAA Scholarship grants and a talk by guest speaker Dr. William Hal Gorby.



Dr. Gorby is a historian of West Virginia and Appalachia, whose work focuses on the role of immigrants in the state's steel and coal mining industries, particularly during the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. He is a teaching associate professor and director of undergraduate advising at West Virginia University. His book, *Wheeling's Polonia: Reconstructing Polish Community in a West Virginia Steel Town* (WVU Press, 2020) examines the Polish and other Eastern European immigrants in Wheeling, and the process of forging a distinct Catholic working class culture in the wider region. Polish immigrants and their children were one of the most prominent of the new ethnic groups in the Upper Ohio Valley. Their Polish-American culture sustained them during the nativism of the 1920's. The Polish were persistently targeted by dry agents during Prohibition, and many openly violated the law, which targeted their ethnic Catholic culture as un-American. Out of these trying times, the Polish-Americans served as a major catalyst behind CIO union organizing at Wheeling Steel in the 1930's and 1940's.

Professor Gorby was recently awarded the 2022 Oskar Halecki Prize by the Polish American Historical Association in recognition of his work, *Wheeling's Polonia* as an important monograph on the Polish experience in the United States.

During our Spring Membership meeting, Professor Gorby will deliver a presentation on *Wheeling's Polonia* and explore nearly 50 years of rich Polonia history in Wheeling, West Virginia. While the people and places described will be unique to the upper Ohio River Valley, the themes explored can be found in Polish communities large and small across the United States and are sure to be of interest to many of our members.
